
# Source 3

Militant leader Abu Musab al-Zarqawi has been killed, Iraqi Prime Minister Nouri Maliki has announced. 'We have eliminated Zarqawi', Mr Maliki said at a news conference in Baghdad, sparking sustained applause. Zarqawi was considered the top leader of the Sunni insurgency. He was the leader of Al-Qa'ida in Iraq, blamed for killing thousands of Shias and US forces.

The Good Friday Agreement of 10 April 1998 launched a 'power sharing' accord between Catholics and Protestants that persists in Northern Ireland to this day. Yet what made the Northern Ireland peace process successful was a series of cold, hard calculations about the future made by politicians who decided that their children would be doomed to misery if they did not compromise. 'The Troubles' had cost about 3,500 people their lives, maimed or scarred 40,000 others, pinned down 18,000 British troops and ruined the economy.
